On Election Day 2017, New Yorkers will be asked if the state should hold a convention to re-write our constitution. It's a bad idea, and here's what voters need to know:



SPECIAL INTEREST TAKEOVER

A constitutional convention would be controlled and dominated by well funded special interests and their lobbyists, who will take advantage of the system, and rewrite the state constitution to benefit only themselves.



OUR RIGHTS AT RISK

The radical agendas of lobbyists would be written in our state constitution and New York families would be left to deal with the impact on our safety, the environment and our schools. Convention delegates influenced by wealthy special interests, not the people, would be able to pick and choose which rights to keep and which to eliminate.
